Activity

Students will explore information about how to finance post-secondary options and relevant information about career choices.

Procedure

Have students use the worksheets to guide exploration of the information at http://aspirations.sparc37.com/. Students should use the worksheets to explore as if they are the students illustrated on them. After exploring information that would be relevant to that student, and taking notes, have students pair up and role play. One student should be the mentor and the other student plays the role of the student on the worksheet. Have the mentor-students advise the other. Then reverse roles.

Students should provide information in each of the three categories. Encourage them to include information about living wages, kinds of employment, and opportunities. Discuss what information they found relevant.
